AJUMOGOBIYA CALLS FOR TRANSPARENCY & ACCOUNTABILITY IN NIGERIA'S OIL & GAS SECTOR.

The Chairman, Expert Advisory Panel of the Nigeria Natural Resource Charter (NNRC) Mr. Odein Ajumogobia (SAN) has reiterated the need for greater transparency and accountability in Nigeria's extractive sector and the oil and gas industry in particular. The high level of opacity in the industry not only hampers economic development but also scares genuine investors away from Nigeria. Mr. Ajumogobia made this known at the Workshop organized by the Nigeria Natural Resource Charter (NNRC) in Lagos on March, 29th 2018 at Protea Hotels Kuramo Waters, Lagos.
